BERNIER RESEARCH AWARD




Major General (MG) Joseph L. Bernier is credited for advancing dental education and military dental research. After receiving his DDS from the University of Illinois in 1932, he served at Walter Reed General Hospital. He subsequently served as the Chief of the Oral Pathology Branch twice in his career, the Chief of the Department Dental Laboratory on the Panama Canal Zone, the Dental Coordinator for the 15th Hospital Center, Director of the Dental Division of McCloskey General Hospital in Temple, TX, and served multiple tours as a Dental Surgeon at Camp Polk and later the 254th General Hospital in the European Theater. MG Bernier lead the Dental Corps as the 14th Army Dental Corps Chief from 1960-1967.

During his tenure as the Dental Corps Chief, MG Bernier helped establish the first 2-year AEGD Program at For Cavazos (Hood), TX in 1961. MG Bernier supported the establishment of the US Army Institute of Dental Research (USAISR) to improve patient care through clinically relevant research.

The Bernier Research Award (BRDC) was established over 28 years ago, as part of the USAISR, aligning with MG Bernier's desire to advance clinical dental care with scientifically backed research. Moving forward, one of the goals of the BRDC is to preserve our traditions and recognize excellence. The research award aligns with the priority of strengthening the Army profession and identifies talent within the Dental Corps. It also encourages publication and writing, which benefits providers' careers both in and outside of the military.

INTRODUCTING THE ARMY GRADUATE DENTAL EDUCATION AMBASSADORS

Army GDE programs provide a path to becoming a master clinician. High quality graduates directly impact the Army's readiness and wellness missions. The Army offers numerous residency and fellowship opportunities through the Long Term Health Education Training (LTHET) program. Becoming a competitive LTHET applicant involves a deliberate process that takes time and preparation. Having good mentorship early is often a key to success.

Mentorship plays an essential role in an Army Dental Officer's professional and leadership development. The Army Dental Corps is full of talent. As such, it is critical to ensure motivated Officers can pursue further education to expand their skills. Although a wide range of GDE opportunities are available, active duty Dental Corps Officers and HPSP students need detailed first-hand information about the different dental specialties and residency programs. For example, many Officers are stationed at locations where dental specialists are not available or accessible, and many HPSP students do not have any connection to an Army Dental Corps Officer or specialist while in school.

To support Army GDE, the Dental Corps' Specialty Consultants to the Surgeon General have appointed nine GDE Ambassadors. The GDE Ambassadors are recent graduates of GDE programs (63B-P) and they can provide year-round access to help interested Officers learn more about different dental specialties, answer questions about residency programs, prepare applicants for the LTHET process, and provide mentorship.

ICT TRAUMA AND ORTHOGNATHIC UPDATE: ENHANCING WAR-TIME READINESS AT JBLM

The ICT Trauma and Orthognathic Update Course, which took place from 12 November–14 November 2024, aimed to bring tri-service surgeons together to review essential war-time readiness skills for deployed Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (OMS) and to explore recent advancements in the planning and execution of orthognathic surgery.

The event welcomed Oral Surgeons from the regional area, Ft. Sill, Navy technicians from Bremerton Naval Hospital, and residents from the Madigan OMS Residency. All participants received Continuing Education (CE) credits for their attendance and updates on ICT requirements.

Held at the Charles Anderson Simulation Center, the course featured topics presented by the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residents at Madigan Army Medical Center and COL Marc Serra. Over two days of didactic lectures and one and a half days of hands-on learning with cadavers provided by J & J Medtech, attendees engaged in comprehensive training.

The ICT trauma section focused on critical anatomy, approaches, and treatment of facial fractures, with updates on medical and surgical management outcomes. COL Serra introduced innovative osteotomy techniques that reduce risks and save surgical time. The use of piezoelectric handpieces has improved safety, facilitating mandibular osteotomies without conventional spreaders and osteotomes. Attendees also learned about reverse vestibulopathy and enhanced submentoplasty, allowing the residency program to reduce operating room time for Lefort, BSSO, and genioplasty procedures from 6-7 hours to 1-3 hours.











ICT TRAUMA AND ORTHOGNATHIC UPDATE: ENHANCING WAR-TIME READINESS AT JBLM

The final day and a half were dedicated to hands-on practice with cadaver heads. Attendees performed orthognathic surgery using stock plating, guided by COL Serra, LTC Smith, MAJ Chang, and MAJ Ellis. The final day focused on facial trauma approaches, including coronal, orbital, pre-auricular, and submandibular techniques, allowing participants to practice procedures they might not regularly perform at their treatment facilities.

The course benefitted local and regional Army surgeons and residents and introduced Navy Surgical Technicians from Bremerton Navy Hospital to the broader scope of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. This familiarization improved their training and understanding of various instruments and procedures.

Overall, the ICT Trauma and Orthognathic Update Course was a great success, providing invaluable hands-on experience and enhancing competence and comfort with procedures, thereby making us a more prepared asset for war-time activities.

TEMPOROMANDIBULAR JOINT DISORDER; TRAINING AND EDUCATION

On November 1st, 2024, Madigan Army Medical Center, together with Zimmer Biomet, hosted a cadaver-based training course focused on temporomandibular joint replacement. The course provided an exceptional opportunity for both military and civilian surgeons to obtain the FDA-mandated certification needed to utilize the Zimmer Biomet stock prosthesis, a

This hands-on training brought together surgeons from various training backgrounds, offering them the chance to refine their surgical techniques under the guidance of Dr. Craig Pearl, an Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeon with extensive experience in TMJ total joint replacement. Participants practiced the precise implantation of the Zimmer Biomet TMJ prosthesis in a controlled, cadaveric setting, ensuring that they could meet the exacting standards required for this procedure.

widely recognized solution for treating severe TMJ disorders.

The event emphasized collaboration between military and civilian medical communities. By hosting this training, Madigan Army Medical Center reinforced its commitment to advancing medical education and improving patient care across both sectors. Additionally, this course allowed military surgeons to meet Individual Critical Task List requirements.

Surgeons left the course not only certified, but also better equipped to offer total joint replacement solutions, enhancing quality of life for patients suffering from debilitating jaw conditions. This initiative underscored the critical role of specialized training in ensuring optimal outcomes for complex surgical interventions.






